COURSE OVERVIEW

The Safe Schools: Preventing Bullying and Cyberbullying course provides a practical introduction to strategies for creating safe, respectful, and inclusive learning environments. Participants will explore the causes, types, and impacts of bullying and cyberbullying on students' well-being and academic achievement. The course covers evidence-based prevention and intervention approaches, including social-emotional learning, digital citizenship education, and whole-school anti-bullying policies. Through a combination of theoretical input, case studies, and collaborative lesson planning, participants will develop practical tools to prevent and respond effectively to bullying and online harassment. By the end of the course, participants will be equipped to foster a positive school climate, support students at risk, and implement sustainable strategies to reduce bullying and cyberbullying.

TARGET AUDIENCE

This course is designed for teachers, school leaders, counsellors, and other education professionals from different educational levels who wish to develop effective strategies to prevent and address bullying and cyberbullying. It is ideal for educators seeking practical tools to create safe, respectful, and inclusive learning environments, support students' well-being, and promote digital citizenship.

REQUIREMENTS

To take part in the course, participants must meet the following requirements:

- Have at least a B1 level of English (independent user);
- Complete and submit the registration form before the start of the training;
- Bring a laptop or tablet to use during the sessions;
- Commit to active participation and attend at least 80% of the course.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

The objectives of the course are:

- To provide participants with a solid understanding of the causes, types, and impacts of bullying and cyberbullying on students' well-being and academic achievement.
- To present evidence-based prevention and intervention strategies applicable to different educational contexts.
- To equip educators with tools to create safe, inclusive, and respectful learning environments.
- To explore digital citizenship and social-emotional learning as key components of prevention.
- To support participants in developing and implementing action plans to effectively prevent and address bullying and cyberbullying in their schools.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

Upon successful completion of this course, learners will be able to:

- 1.Explain the causes, forms, and consequences of bullying and cyberbullying on students' well-being and learning.
- 2. Identify risk factors and warning signs of bullying and online harassment.
- 3. Apply evidence-based strategies to prevent and respond to bullying and cyberbullying.
- 4. Promote digital citizenship, empathy, and social-emotional skills among students as preventive measures.
- 5. Collaborate effectively with colleagues, families, and communities to create safe and inclusive school environments.
- 6. Develop policies and classroom practices that reduce bullying and support at-risk students.
- 7. Design an action plan to implement sustainable bullying prevention initiatives in their schools.

METHODOLOGY

The course is structured around a rigorous methodology that combines theoretical exposition, practical work, and applied demonstrations. This approach ensures a thorough understanding of the subject matter and its direct application in real-world contexts.

Theoretical sessions provide essential foundations, while practical work and demonstrations facilitate the development of technical skills and familiarity with the specific tools and procedures relevant to the course.

Continuous monitoring through individualized feedback allows for tracking learners' progress and ensures the achievement of the set objectives, preparing participants to face professional challenges with competence and precision.

ASSESSMENT

Assessment is carried out continuously throughout the course, using a holistic and learner-centered approach that reflects both participation and performance. Each participant is evaluated based on their overall engagement, regular attendance, punctuality, interest in the topics covered, ability to apply knowledge during practical tasks, and interaction with peers in individual and group activities.

The evaluation process includes a variety of classroom-based tasks (oral and written), short daily assignments, role-plays, and simulations. Trainers provide ongoing, individualized feedback to support progress and encourage active learning.

A Certificate of Participation is awarded to participants who attend at least 80% of the sessions and demonstrate consistent involvement and commitment during the training.



DURATION

The standard duration of our course is 20 hours (5 days), designed to ensure comprehensive and effective learning. However, this duration can be adjusted, in specific cases, to meet the particular needs of each group, in order to optimize outcomes and better suit the training context.

Upon completion of the course, a formal certification ceremony will take place, during which the certificates will be presented to the participants.
